School and Community

“Cambridge High School...educating, challenging and inspiring all students to reach their full potential and achieve college and career readiness” is the mission that drives Cambridge High School. Opening its doors in August 2012 to serve the communities of Alpharetta and Milton in the northwestern suburb of Atlanta, the school currently has an enrollment of 2063 students. Cambridge adopted the “Bears” as the mascot with navy blue, Carolina blue, and white as the official colors.

Cambridge High School offers a broad program of courses and experiences that address the academic, physical, and social needs of its students. Students can participate in a variety of academic, enrichment, and extra-curricular study halls through P.A.W.S., People Always Willing to Share and Support, and service organizations with over 85 clubs, literary publications, and sports teams from which to choose. Freshman engage in G.R.O.W.L., Gaining Relevant Opportunities Through Wednesday Learning and C.L.A.W.S., Caring Learning and Adapting While Succeeding, Cambridge’s ninth grade transition programs. Cambridge High School offers six classes, a lunch period, and opportunities for individual enrichment and advancement each day. The school year consists of two eighteen week semesters.

Curriculum Highlights

Cambridge High School offers a multitude of programs that encourage students to pursue special interests. Students selected for the Talented and Gifted (TAG) program have the opportunity to enroll in seminar courses, directed study courses, and internships. Over forty percent of the student body participates in the TAG program. Performing arts and visual arts are available to interested students, along with career technology pathways for those who wish to explore different career options: Business and Computer Science, Broadcast and Video Production, Law and Justice, Marketing, Engineering Technology, and the newly added Veterinary Sciences. Students also can choose to participate in the Work-Based Learning program.

Dual enrollment opportunities exist for all students who wish to earn college credit. College Calculus 2 and 3 are taught on the Cambridge campus by Georgia Institute of Technology through a distance learning program. College English 1101, 1102, College Algebra, and College Statistics are offered at the campus through Young Harris College.
