Our Focus

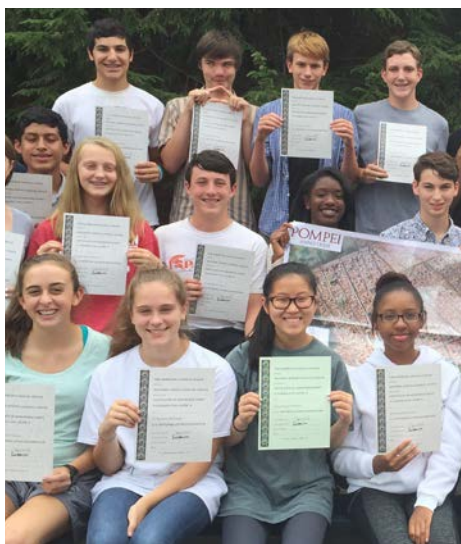

English Language Arts

English Language Arts connects student lives to the lives of others through great literature -with opportunities to read and respond critically, write creatively and analytically; and develop effective research and communication skills.

Core Requirements

Students are required to earn 4 core Language Arts credits for graduation in Georgia.



Social Studies

Provides opportunities for students to develop their ability to think clearly and to integrate significant facts, concepts and generalizations from history and the social sciences into their own experiences.

Core Requirements

1 semester (.5 unit) American Government,
1 semester (.5 unit) Economics
1 year World History and
1 year United States History

World Languages

Offers the study of language and culture in Chinese, French, Latin and Spanish.

Core Requirements

All students must complete a minimum of 2 years or units of the same world language. For college-bound students, 3 or 4 years of the same world language, depending on school and major, is recommended.
