CREATE A PARCHMENT ACCOUNT


- 1. Go to the Sign up page, and fill in the fields.
 - If you select that you are interested in colleges/scholarship programs discovering you, you will be asked to enter information about your academic history.
- Yes, I am Interested in colleges and scholarship programs discovering me through Parchment
- No, I do not want to be discovered by colleges and scholarship programs looking for students like me
- 2. Click Start by adding a school or organization you attended.
- 3. Enter the name of the school you attend(ed) in the search box and click Search.
- 4. When your school appears, click Add and then fill in the fields on the Add Enrollment Information page.



If you received an email from your school with a link in it, or a handout with a code, follow the instructions in the email or handout to register. Or if your school's website has a link to Parchment on it, use that link because you may be able to register in fewer steps.

ORDER YOUR TRANSCRIPT

- 1. Sign in to your account.
- 2. Click Order under the name of your school.
- 3. You will see two destination options. If you are sending your transcript to a school, select the option on the left. If you are sending it to yourself or to another individual, select the option on the right:



If you select the option on the left, you will be presented with a search box where you will search for the destination. If the destination that you are sending your transcript to does not appear, click Enter Your Own to manually enter the destination.



- 4. Continue filling in the fields to place your order. Information on the next page tells you more about the options that you will see here.
- 5. On the Provide Consent page you (or your parent/guardian) authorizes Parchment to release your transcript from your school once we receive the transcript. You can sign with your mouse or finger.
- 6. Finally, you will make a payment (we accept Visa, Mastercard, Discover, and American Express), and you can then begin to track your order.



IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

Remember that your school has your transcript. If you track your order and see **Order submitted to school** as your order status, please contact your school if you are concerned about a delay in processing your order.

ELECTRONIC AND PAPER TRANSCRIPTS

Sending and receiving electronic transcripts is fast, easy, and secure, but we know that there may be times when you need to send paper transcripts. Since some schools in the Parchment network may only want to receive electronic transcripts, you may not be presented with a choice of delivery methods.




For electronic transcripts, the recipient will either receive an email with a link in it to access your transcript, or, if the recipient is a school that is part of our Parchment network, the electronic transcript will land in their Parchment account.



For paper transcripts, you have the option to send your transcript by USPS mail or overnight delivery. We use FedEx for overnight delivery. FedEx does not deliver on Saturdays and Sundays. Remember that your school must approve and process your order before we can send your transcript, so if you select overnight delivery, your transcript may not be delivered the next day if there is a delay with your school processing your order.

During your order, you will be presented with a drop-down menu where you can select if you want to wait until your next grades are in before sending your transcript.

Eligibility for the HOPE Scholarship

Basic Eligibility

All HOPE programs require students to meet basic requirements. An eligible student must:

- 1. Meet HOPE's U.S. citizenship or eligible non-citizen requirements;
- 2. Be a legal resident of Georgia;
- 3. Meet enrollment requirements;
- 4. Be in compliance with Selective Service registration requirements;
- 5. Meet academic achievement standards;
- 6. Be in good standing on all student loans or other financial aid programs;
- 7. Be in compliance with the Georgia Drug-Free Postsecondary Education Act of 1990;
- 8. Not have exceeded the maximum award limits for any HOPE program.

Program Eligibility

To receive HOPE Scholarship funding, students must:

- 1. Meet one of the following academic requirements:
 - Graduate from a HOPE-eligible high school with a minimum 3.0 grade point average (as calculated by GSFC). Details
 - Receive a high school diploma through petition of the local school board, in accordance with O.C.G.A. §20-2-281.1, from a HOPE-eligible high school with a minimum 3.0 grade point average (as calculated by GSFC). Details
 - o Graduate from an ineligible high school, complete a home study program in Georgia, or earn a GED and score in the national composite 75th percentile or higher on the SAT or ACT prior to high school graduation, home study completion, or earning a GED. <u>Details</u>
 - o Graduate from an ineligible high school or complete a home study program in Georgia and then earn a minimum 3.0 cumulative postsecondary grade point average after attempting 30 semester or 45 quarter hours of college degree-level coursework for retroactive HOPE Scholarship payment.
 - Earn a minimum 3.0 cumulative postsecondary grade point average after attempting 30, 60, or 90 semester hours or 45, 90, or 135 quarter hours after high school graduation, home study completion, or receipt of GED. Details
- 2. Be enrolled as a degree-seeking student at a public or private <u>HOPE-eligible college or university</u> in Georgia.
- 3. Meet academic rigor requirements. Beginning with students graduating from an eligible high school on or after May 1, 2015, students must complete a specific number of academically rigorous courses, as identified on the Academic Rigor Course List, in addition to meeting the GPA requirements. This does not include students who received a high school diploma through petition of his or her local school board, in accordance with O.C.G.A. §20-2-281.1, nor does it apply to students graduating from home study programs.

How To Track Your HOPE Academic Eligibility

Georgia's HOPE Programs are for those students who demonstrate academic achievement, not only in high school but throughout their time in college.

Beginning in high school, Georgia students are able to track their <u>My High School HOPE GPA</u> through their GA futures account to know if they are on track to earn the <u>HOPE</u> and <u>Zell Miller Scholarship</u>.

Now, with the <u>My College HOPE Profile</u>, students who have earned the <u>HOPE</u> or <u>Zell Miller Scholarship</u>, as well as the <u>HOPE</u> or <u>Zell Miller Grant</u>, can track their academic eligibility while attending a HOPE-eligible Georgia college or university.

Note: GAfutures accounts require the student's Social Security number and date of birth in order to provide the student's secure academic data.
