Rising 11th Grade HONORS Summer 2017 Reading Selections

- 1. Read and annotate *How to Read Literature like a Professor* by Thomas Foster. (The same one you may have read for 10th Grade Honors Summer reading). We will use this book all year long.
- 2. Read and annotate *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* by Mark Twain (See instructions below).

Critical Analysis Sheet for *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. Please type your responses.

- 1. As you read Twain's novel, annotate notes about the following:
 - -Author's tone.
 - -Author's use of diction, word choice, dialects, and humor.
 - -Author's use of figurative language.
 - -Author's techniques used in characterization.
 - -The overall mood of the story.
 - -The description of the setting(s).
- 2. Give a two-three paragraph plot summary of the novel in your own words.
- 3. Make a bullet list of the main themes of the book.
- 4. List and describe the major characters and their characteristics. (One paragraph each).
- 5. In a two-three paragraph response, describe how the book exemplifies Foster's *How to Read Literature Like a Professor* chapter 15, "Flights of Fancy." How does the book prove Foster's point in this chapter?
- 6. Describe how the book exemplifies any TWO of the OTHER chapters (1-14, 16-26 in *How to Read Literature Like a Professor* -- You choose). How does Twain's novel demonstrate Foster's points in the two chapters you selected? Make sure you write two-three paragraphs for EACH of the two chapter responses and justify your responses with detailed examples.

NOTE: You will need to type your answers on a separate sheet. Please use *details* in your answers and follow the minimum length guidelines given for each part of the response.
