District Goals

The FCBOE set goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2015 –2016 are:

- **Graduation Rate—90%** of
Fulton County students graduate on time.
- **College Readiness - 85%** of
Fulton County high school seniors will be eligible for admission to a University System of Georgia College or University
- **Career Readiness—100%** of Fulton County students will be work ready certified.

TCHS School Goals

- Increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding the standard in GSE Algebra I and GSE Geometry by 5 percent as outlined by the Georgia Department of Education.
- Improve the cohort Graduation rate of students by 5 percent as measured by CCRPI by June 2016.

Increase # of Students meeting Standards in GSE Algebra I and Geometry

TCHS School Administration, Staff and Teachers, WE will:

- Implement the Title I Flexible Learning Program to provide Math Support and Tutorial for subject mastery in GSE Algebra and Geometry.
- Provide students and parents with technology and resources to help students with their mathematical skills via the Parent Resource Center by conducting a series of parent workshops to educate parents on math requirements and the Georgia Milestones test math blogs for the students to learn and practice at home.
- Update Home Access in a timely manner to keep parents and students abreast of progress and respond to parents requests for conferences/assistance in a timely manner.

TCHS Parents/Guardians, WE will:

- Ensure my student attends the tutoring sessions offered through the FLP program if eligible .
- Commit to my student's education by attending school goal oriented math workshops .
- Communicate with my child about his/her classwork and cross reference with information you have obtained from their teacher.
- Encourage your child to study daily and ask questions about their achievements and challenges.
- Track my student's academic progress utilizing the Home Access Center and address any concerns such as attendance, behavior and grades in a timely manner.
- Be proactive and request conferences if my child's average in class falls below a 75%.

TCHS Students, WE will:

- Attend math tutorial to receive extra support that's needed for understanding and mastery.
- Use the website my teacher provides to complete math pre-test, practice and quizzes.
- Maintain adequate attendance including being on time for school and all classes via attendance monitoring. Track my grades and attendance via Home Access and be proactive by addressing any inaccurate information in a timely manner.

Increase the Graduation Rate

TCHS School Administration, Staff and Teachers, WE will:

- Provide frequent reviews of transcript and ongoing advisement on graduation status/requirements.

TCHS Parents/Guardians WE will:

- Meet with my student's guidance counselor/teachers to discuss progress and strategies for academic success and monitor my student's transcript.

TCHS Students , WE will:

- Monitor my transcript and credits semi-annually to ensure I meet all graduation requirements.
