The FCBOE set goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2016 –2017 are:

- **Graduation Rate—90%** of Fulton County students graduate on time.
- **College Readiness - 85%** of Fulton County high school seniors will be eligible for admission to a University System of Georgia College or University
- **Career Readiness—100%** of Fulton County students will be work ready certified.
