In the Junior Division of Biochemistry, Sariah Buford won 2nd Place. Darius Davis, Davagughn Jones, London Jacks, and Nathaniel Leverette also presented terrific science fair projects. Alaina James, Jarquavious Hart, and Anna Gomez placed 3rd in the Fulton County Schools Social Studies Fair. Camp Creek was acknowledged by the district for being the overall performance leader on the Math Interim Assessment III. Our scholars are performing at top levels when compared with students throughout Fulton County.
