CAMP CREEK MIDDLE SCHOOL GOALS:

Camp Creek Middle School in increase the percentage of students Reading on grade level by five percentage points as measured by the Lexile scores on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade:

Goal #1: By May 2019, our students will make a 20% increase in ELA/Reading scores. 75% will be at grade level in reading, and 80% at grade level in reading.

Goal #2: By May 2019, our students will make a 20% increase in math; 75% will be at grade level in math, and 80% at grade level in math.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, we will commit to do the following:

SCHOOL /TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Camp Creek Middle School will:

- Provide families with the strategies and tools to utilize graphic organizers to assist with reading comprehension during parent-teacher conferences and via Camp Creek Middle School Facebook & Twitter. The strategies will include, but are not limited to:

- providing instructions on how to help their students identify the characters, settings, plots and events,
- generating questions to determine if students are understanding what is taught
- using appropriate strategies to determine problems with comprehension
- Provide families with Math concepts which includes strategies such as:
 - Independent practice modules (virtual assistance program)
 - Review and practice basic math concept
- Provide a series of Reading and Math parent workshops to be held at school during multiple time to accommodate parent schedules.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Monitor and ensure that my students are identifying the characters, settings, plot, and events; I will learn to ask my child questions that require them to combine information from different segments of text.
- Ensure my students are independently practicing math concepts at home; will utilize the virtual assistance program to assist their student at home.
- Attend the academic parent workshops to support my student at home.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

As a student I will:

- Utilize graphic organizer as a strategy to help students identify characters, settings, plots, and events. By identifying story characters, plot, setting, problem and solution, students read carefully to learn the details. Students will learn to ask themselves questions that require them to combine information from different segments of text.
- Practice math skills independently at home and use the virtual assistance program provided by the Math teacher.
- Will use the strategies that my parents received at the workshops
