AVID: HELP WANTED

Are you looking for a way to be consistently involved in the growth and academic development of students at Haynes Bridge? If so, we need you! Haynes Bridge, currently has 4 sections of AVID. AVID is a national, non-profit, organization that stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. One of the essential elements of the AVID curriculum is the influence and support of tutors.

You do not need to be an expert in the 6th, 7th or 8th grade content! You just need to be willing to learn the AVID strategies to guide students in learning how to address their points of confusion within various content areas, as well as have a heart for helping kids succeed!

College students and adults will be paid \$15 an hour. High school seniors who are taking AP classes or are dually enrolled will be paid \$10 an hour. Tutors will begin in October and can serve in the 3rd period class(7th Grade) which is 10:45-11:30 am, 6th Period (8th grade) from 1:30-2:15, 7th period class(7th Grade) which is 2:30-3:09 pm, 8th period(6th Grade) which is from 3:15-4:05 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Tutors will be trained in a one day training provided by Fulton County. There will be a fee for fingerprinting and obtaining a Fulton County tutor badge. A one year commitment is expected of all those who volunteer. You do not need to come for all periods, it is extremely flexible.

Checking your student out of school early? Here is the proper procedure:

- ◆ Send a note with your student with the time and reason for early dismissal.
- ◆ Your student brings the note to the front office.
- ◆ We will stamp his/her agenda with the time the student may leave class.
- ◆ Student leaves class at the appropriate time and meets you in the front office.
- ◆ **ALWAYS bring your ID.** We will not release a student to anyone that is not on the student's contact list and who does not have appropriate ID.
- ◆ No check outs after 3:45 pm.

Dropping Items Off for Your Student at School?

- ◆ **Bring to front office. Attach name tag with student's name and date.**
